Douglas Glatfelder, 81, died on Nov. 11, 1996 at Plains Regional Medical Center in Clovis.

Glatfelder was born Oct. 3 in Caney, Kan. to Treva and Elba Clayton Glatfelder.

He was reared in Blackwell, Okla. On May 21, 1936 he married Modeen Travis in Pawnee, Okla.
