

John Glatfelter, retired chemist

John P. Glatfelter, 73, of Upper Darby, a retired chemist, died Tuesday at Mercy Haverford Hospital.

Mr. Glatfelter was employed as a chemist for Merck & Co. Inc. for 40 years until retiring in 1986. At one point, he was a department head in the analytical division there.

Mr. Glatfelter was born in Columbia, Lancaster County, and graduated from Columbia High School. He received a degree in chemistry from Philadelphia College of Pharmacy and Science in Philadelphia in 1942. Later, he also studied at Temple University.

He enlisted in the Army Air Corps during World War II and trained as a pilot.

After his discharge in 1945, he worked for a year at Atlantic Refinery in Philadelphia before joining Merck in 1946.

Mr. Glatfelter was a communicant of St. Laurence Church in Highland Park and was a member of the Pinzon Council 905 of the Knights of Columbus.
