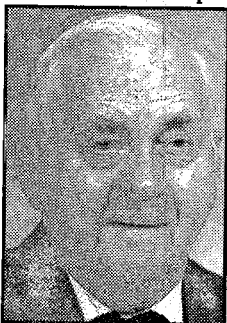
# Ralph W.E. Gable

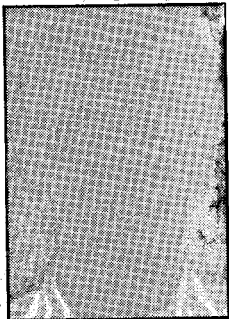

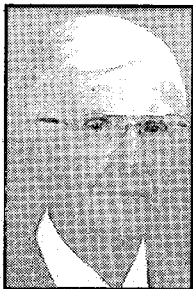
