Jacqueline D. Hollinger, 88, formerly of 30 Foreman Road, and more recently of Masonic Village Elizabethtown, died of natural causes on Thursday at Magnolia, an assisted living community in Chambersburg, PA.

Born Jacqueline Nancy Duffenderfer on October 25, 1921, in Harrisburg, she was the daughter of Clarence Walter and Adeline (Glatfelter) Duffenderfer, who owned and operated Diff's Place between Middletown and Elizabethtown.

She graduated from Elizabethtown High School and attended Elizabethtown College for two years as a laboratory technician.

Jackie - or "Jake", as she was often called - was a member of St. Paul's United Methodist Church in Elizabethtown for nearly 75 years. She sang in the choir and participated in numerous United Women activities, particularly the prayer chain and funeral luncheon functions.

Jackie never sought personal recognition but cheerfully and unselfishly gave of her time and talents in a variety of other endeavors. Following her mother's lead, she was active in East as Worthy Matron in the Middletown Chapter in the late fifties. She was involved in Elizabeth Heritage House Museum from its inception, volunteering in various capacities for more than 40 years. She assisted in numerous activities at Masonic Village for over 20 years; and she was active in the Hughes Society where she participated in the American Cancer Society's Daffodil Days.

She was skilled at knitting, crocheting, and sewing - much to the joy of her children and grand children. She was also an avid card player, for many years active in both bridge and pinochle clubs. She was for Peck's Dress Shop, Oberlin, especially during Sunday Brunches at the Hotel Hershey. Jackie loved theater, music, singing and dancing. She played the piano and had a great affinity for the classics. For all, she was energetic, joyous and outgoing, and her winning, natural smile was known by those who knew her.

She was preceded in death by Emory E. Stouffer, her first husband, in 1967, and by her second husband, Arthur S. (Cash) Hollinger, in 2007.

She is survived by a brother, Wait R. Duffenderfer, husband of Carol (Norton), New Cumberland, PA; and also surviving are three sons, Colonel Thomas D. Stouffer, USMC (Ret.) husband of Deanne, Shippensburg; Larry A. She will be greatly missed by a wide circle of friends and extended family members.
