


Dr. Anna V. Gladfelter, MD



Heather's grandfather is our very own Dean Gladfelter who is one of our Directors.




Dr. Heather Lyn Gladfelter, MD

FTR is an emblem designed to give everyone the power to wear their hope on their sleeve and walk alongside everyone else who is in the middle of their own race.




Glattfelders in Medicine Dr. Joel Glotfelty, MD

Glattfelders in Medicine Joel and Samatha Glotfelty


Outside of medicine Samatha and Joel enjoy spending time together, especially with their pups Hulk and Loki.




Robert and Tracy Clodfelter

This section is a tribute to those Glattfelders who have passed.








Dr. Noah M. Glatfelter, MD 1837 - 1911

Perhaps our most famous physician is Dr. Noah Glatfelter whose story has been told many times at our reunions.

A plaque stands here at Heimwald in his honor.

Dr. Noah M. Glatfelter, MD

Dr. Glatfelter served as a surgeon during the Civil War and was present at the second battle of Bull Run.

When he stopped practicing medicine he became interest in mushrooms with his daughter Lisbeth.

There remain seven fungi named for him in the Index Fungorum, the leading authority on the subject.



Dr. Robert Gladfelter, DVM 1853 - 1932

Dr. Robert Gladfelter was a veterinarian who specialized in large animals, especially horses.

He worked for the city of Philadelphia taking care of the horses which was an extremely important job, since this was prior to cars and trucks.

When Robert's young son died at 28 and left a widow Alma, and three young children, Robert III (6 yrs), Dorothy (4yrs), and William (2 yrs), they moved in with Dr. Robert and his wife Marie.

Because the children were so young, Dr. Robert became the father figure; however, the children called him "Granddaddy".



Yvonne "Bonnie" Clark Glatfelter, RN 1928 - 2018

Bonnie pursued a career in nursing and graduated at the Lancaster General Hospital School of Nursing in the class of 1949.

She remained at LGH until her second child, Becky, was born.

Bonnie and Dick settled on a small farm in East Petersburg and raised three children there, Michael, Becky, and Amy.

After leaving LGH, Bonnie did private duty nursing and volunteering many years at Luther Acres.

Bonnie and Dick started a club called the Red Rose Pony Club, which promoted Families taking Sunday Carriage rides.

She was an active member of Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church, East Petersburg where she taught Sunday School.



Bonnie and Dick were founding members of the East Petersburg Historical Society.

Bonnie was also active in the Casper Glattfelder Foundation.

Bonnie passed away on April 4, 2018, at the age of 90.

Story told by Michael Glatfelter how his nurse Mom and Dad met.

She met her husband, Richard L. "Dick" Glatfelter in the LGH Emergency Room after he was in a car accident with two broken legs and a four-month stay in the hospital.



Sandra D. Glatfelter, RN 1937 - 2022

Sandra Glatfelter was registered nurse who worked in the operating room at UPMC Pinnacle, Lancaster for 58 years before retiring at the end of 2017 at 80.

She was known there as "Mama Bird".

Born in Stillwater, Pennsylvania she was the daughter of Clyde and Edith Karns.

She was a 1956 graduate of Benton High School and a 1959 graduate of St. Joseph Hospital School of Nursing, Lancaster.

She resided in Lancaster for 63 years.

Dr. Philip Glotfelty was a general surgeon who practiced medicine in Marshall, Michigan at the Oaklawn Hospital for many years.

He believed in service-above-self and took medical calls at home at all hours of the day or night.


As a Christian he was driven to love and help other people. "I wanted to do more than just pray for people's health," he would say.

"We have to remember, we all come from a miracle," he professed a few days before his passing. "We're all angels."



Dr. Scott A. Glotfelty, DVM 1960 - 1988

Dr. Glotfelty a young veterinarian who joined the Peace Corps where he served on a small husbandry and extension program in Togo, West Africa.

Nine months into his service, Scott was hiking ahead of some friends and climbed a large Teak tree. When his friends arrived, they found him under the tree covered in bees.

Local villagers scrambled to light a smoky fire to expel the bees, but unfortunately it was too late, he had succumbed to the hundreds of stings.

Scott was but 27 when he passed.

This is Scott's story but not his legacy.

His nephew Darryl Glotfelty tells a deeper story of Scott.

Inspired by Scott, Darryl was also a Peace Corps volunteer and served in Tanzania.
